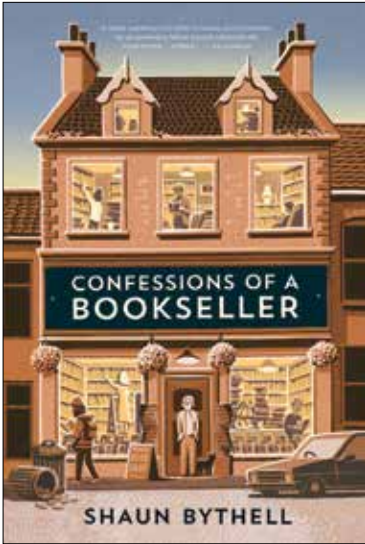

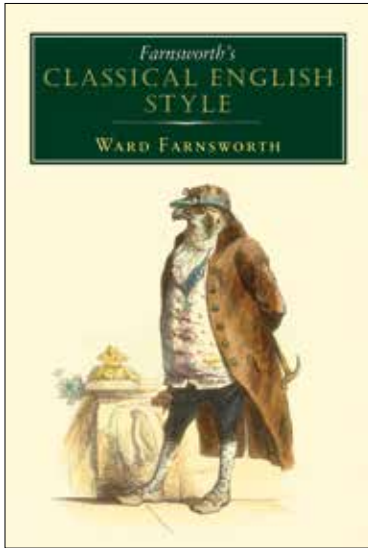

## Farnsworth's Classical English Style

Ward Farnsworth

*Say it with style—on paper or in person—Farnsworth is back with more than 100 examples of the best and richest choices the language has to offer.*

Most modern books about style are about how to avoid mistakes and offer advice: write this way, not that way. This book does not offer advice of that kind or formulas. This book is about stylistic virtue by way of examples in generous supply. It takes only a few words to explain a precept, but only illustrations, lots of them from many settings, can make an idea familiar to the ear.

While books on style usually emphasize some general principles, this book spends a lot of time on details. Farnsworth asks why good writing sounds that way through many small choices in words, rhythm, and the construction of sentences and explains how those choices put force into writing and speech.

*Farnsworth's Classical English Style* is third in a series about principles of good writing, derived from an earlier age in the life of the language. Writers of lasting stature still make the best teachers. They understood principles of style that are powerful and enduring.

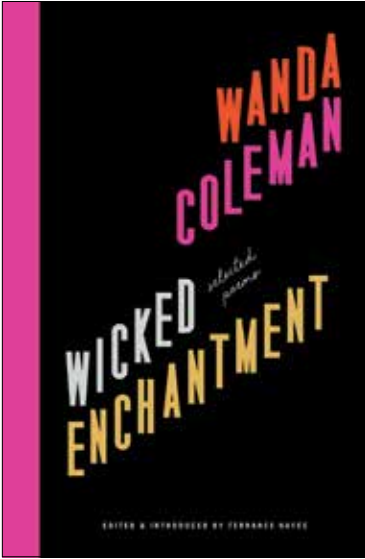

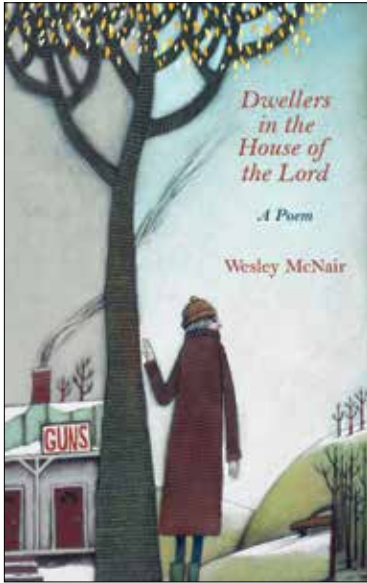

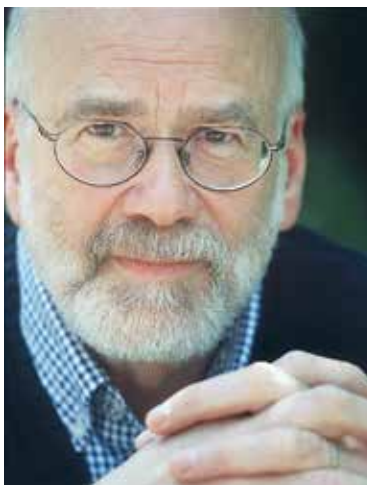

## Dwellers in the House of the Lord

Wesley McNair

*A new book-length poem explores the potential for love and reconciliation in an era when political strife ensnarls our homes and country.*

In this book-length narrative poem, award-winning poet Wesley McNair takes us to rural Virginia, where his younger sister Aimee is adrift in a difficult marriage to Mike, an off-the-grid gun shop owner. As Aimee grapples with self-doubt and searches for solace in a megachurch, Mike's misunderstandings are magnified by the self-first ideology and fear-of-others philosophy swirling around him. McNair casts this intimate family struggle against Trump's noisy public race to the White House.

Amid the complexity of personal relationships and publicly divisive politics that engulf our country, McNair seeks to understand his troubled sister, his angry brother-in-law, and the dream of immigrants in his family. In the end, his poetic gaze guides us toward patience and perseverance, the belief that compassion in the face of confusion is the only path forward. *Dwellers in the House of the Lord* is a thoughtful assessment of the values that shape us at home and across the nation, and a timely poem that is, in the end, a story of love and reconciliation.
